Most dogs come in to rescue needing some or all of the following veterinary care: shots, spayed/neutered, microchip, heartworm test and monthly anti-parasite heartworm preventative medication. Some dogs require additional vet care for existing conditions. The average cost of getting a healthy dog ready for adoption is about \$145.00. Every donation you make helps with these expenses. If you prefer, your donations can be made with specific instructions regarding how they are to be used - directly to vet expenses, for Mark Minpin's surgery, for a dog that needs insulin, for any dog that needs help, etc.. If you purchase Taste of the Wild or Natural Balance dog food for donation we will gladly pick it up if you contact us and let us know where we should go.



Dr. Joshua Winston, DVM has opened a new low cost clinic that is open from Wednesday through, and including, Sunday, 8:00 AM to 5:00 PM. Sun Valley Hope fulfills his life long dream of a "clinic devoted to low cost, full service medical and surgical care for rescue groups and the general public who have significant financial restraints." Dr. Winston goes on to say "Both these groups are even more challenged in this terrible economy. Though I can name a number of things I enjoy practicing vet medicine, I have always found working with rescues the most rewarding. Rescue work is the pure thought most kids have when they want to be a veterinarian though they may not know it at the time."

Sun Valley's mission states Dr. Winston, "is to go beyond the routine low cost well services clinics that exist now. Rescues and the general public have a number of great choices here in the valley for low cost neuters, spays, vaccinations and well testing. We offer those services also...but what we will be supplying is medical, surgical, and dental and hospital care for sick and injured animals. We are a full service clinic and can

handle anything up to our skill level. So....we will be able to handle at least 80%-90% of all situations."

As you know our beloved pets usually get sick after 5 pm and on the weekends. To help sick pets and their humans, Sun Valley Hope is open Wednesday thru, and including, Sunday from 8am to 5pm. Dr, Winston states "We both know how hard it is for fosters to get a rescue animal to a vet during the week so we are open for Saturday and Sunday. Plus it is always on the weekend when a pet gets sick and since we are open on the weekend's people may be able to avoid a trip to the much more expensive emergency clinic.

All fees have been adjusted downward by at least 40% and many times even 60% compared to the average cost of a mainstream hospital and once again because we are open Sundays we are a cost effective alternative to the ER.

We also provide care to the general pet owning public. However we are really targeting the percentage of the public who truly have financial restraints. Many problems are simple and straightforward and predictably to rational care but financial challenges can shut out good care for many pets. So we will help end that and perhaps avoid the unfortunate 'financial euthanasia 'we all see too often.

We will continue to do what I do know..if any member of the general public reaches out to the rescue network for help with their pet but have limited means we will help with first a free evaluation and hopefully a cost effective treatment plan which would be at least 40% to 60% less expensive than most routine fees.

So yes we will have the all the low cost services commonly offered but the major thrust is for all the other things that there are few if any low cost alternatives. Low cost does not mean low quality. What is really scary is the up-front costs as the hospital is as well supplied and high tech as most other practices and includes radiography, otoscopy, full surgical suite, onsite full laboratory for quick blood results when needed, dental service etc. "We have just cut out a lot of the excess profit. Our aim is to just break even at the end of the year..."

Dr. Winston has helped many of our rescue minpins over the past 3 years. His exceptional level of care and service along with that of his professional staff make a trip to Dr Winston, at either of his clinics, a great experience.

The office visit is \$20 at Sun Valley Hope Animal Hospital and if you get the 4 in 1 and rabies shots the total cost for the visit is \$30 - \$15 per vaccination which includes the office visit! You can't beat that! All vaccinations for dogs and cats are \$15 except for bordatella which is \$17! Spays and neuters are \$70 to \$120 but call to verify that as the charges are abased on weight of the animal.

Arizona Partnership

Over the past 10 years Arizona Partnership has refined a process that has successfully rehabilitated over 1200 dogs from such unwanted behavior as aggression, separation anxiety, housebreaking, destroving items, digging, excessive barking, and pulling on lead. Their copyrighted process establishes the human as Alpha over the canines while focusing directly on removing the bad behavior. The consultative approach develops a Behavior Modification Plan with incremental 2 week goals, focusing on the successful rehabilitation of the problem canine. Sometimes the frustration can be overwhelming. Maricopa County Animal Care and Control: New Hope Program

The purpose of MCACC's New Hope Program is to find permanent homes for animals that are not adopted under regular shelter circumstances, and to acknowledge, cooperate with, and support the efforts of other animal care, training, rescue, welfare, and control organizations. The New Hope Program is a partnership between MCACC and other animal welfare agencies to help ensure that as many adoptable animals as possible are placed into permanent and loving homes. New Hope partners take animals from MCACC that might otherwise have to be euthanized. New Hope Partner Organizations are Animal organizations that are established or recognized in their communities as animal shelters, animal welfare organizations, animal rescue organizations, and veterinary hospitals within the State of Arizona may be eligible to participate, subject to approval, by MCACC.
